## Welcome Tina Cupell'aq Harness!





### **Artifact of the Month**



The SJM artifact of the month is a set of six walrus ivory belt fasteners. The object records contain very little information and the makers(s), source of collecting, and collector are unknown. It is likely that these are Iñupiaq, date to the 19th century, and were collected by Sheldon Jackson. These may have been used on caribou mandible belts worn by Iñupiaq or Yup'ik women and highlight the great variety of designs belt fasteners take. Read more.
