The spring speaker series is upon us with Lou Logan (Inupiaq) on March 12th at 1:00pm giving a presentation titled, "Building the Inupiaq Qayaq". He will share photographs of his boat building and his research on watercraft. Logan has been making kayaks since 2019 and currently has a solo live working exhibit at the Alaska State Museum in Juneau that involves building a qayaq right next to a historical example from the collection. The talk will be only inperson at the museum due to the scheduled internet outage from March 7-17 in Sitka. The program will be recorded and archived on our YouTube channel.

SJM Interpretive Plan



The SJM Interpretive Plan 2024 is published and outlining opportunities for implementation has begun with some short-term goals from the plan:

- Name Change In the planning survey, 71% of respondents were in favor of having the name changed from Sheldon Jackson Museum.
- **Welcome Exhibit** Update and replace the introductory exhibit in the lobby. Potential themes may include an explanation to visitors that we are on Lingít Aaní, the land of Sheet'ká Kwáan.
- **Signage** Replace dated exterior signage and create templates for interior signs. With templates, SJ Museum staff can make temporary signs about events and information.
- Facility Planning Hire a professional museum design firm to assist staff in pre-development planning to prepare conceptual design alternatives and cost estimates for museum expansion.
