Guest Speaker

Chuna McIntyre shares garments, song and dance, and stories in a presentation given in both the Yup'ik language and in English. Chuna is a Yup'ik garment maker, painter, storyteller, and cultural expert. Born in Eek, a small village on the coast of the Bering Sea, McIntyre learned traditional Yup'ik dance, stories, and songs from his grandmother. He later founded and directed the Nunamta Yup'ik Eskimo Singers & Dancers, a troupe that has traveled the world. In 2007, he was an artist demonstrator at SJM, in 2019 the museum brought him back for a consultation project focusing on documenting the Yup'ik mask collection, and in 2024 to consult for the bead deterioration project.
